The USAF Security Forces Museum, formerly known as The USAF Security Police Museum, was dedicated November 5, 1979. The mission of the museum is to interpret and preserve the history of the career field. The structure you see today was originally a single story building that quickly filled with memorabilia representing the formation of the Air Police in 1947 through the Security Police involvement in Vietnam. As the collection outgrew the facility the Security Forces Museum Foundation ran world wide fundraisers to enlarge the Museum. With this addition the Security Forces Museum now had room to expand its exhibits to cover additional decades of Security Forces history and heritage.

Exhibits of significant events and operations in the career field continue to grow and are interpreted through the use of artifacts, photographs and memorabilia.

# Exhibits

The first floor of the USAF Security Forces Museum is filled to the rim with intense information and artifacts that tell great stories of courage, teamwork and will power that men and women gave to fulfill their duties for their country. When you enter the museum you are greeted by the era of the Air Police (1947-1966) and the Security Police in Southeast Asia (1967-1973).

## *Security Forces in the 90s*



In these two exhibits you visit the beginnings of the Air Police and the Air Force. You learn about the experiences of the men who fought in Vietnam, see actual Viet-Cong and US military uniforms used during that time, and view real weapons used in the fight. As you make your way around the first-floor of the museum you experience three more decades of the Security Police/Security Forces. In each of these decades you will find changes in the uniform, advancements in technology and changes in Southwest Asia at the end of the Cold War. Of special significance is the Hall of Honor. Here the museum pays respect to those who have fallen in the line of duty and to those who have been awarded great merit.



The second floor of the Security Forces Museum showcases our Into The 21st Century display and nine different specialty areas in the career field. The Military Working Dog, Allied Forces, Competitive Marksmanship Program and various badges and berets that have been used throughout the years are but a few on exhibit.
